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Dear Patients,

Biomechanical evaluation and orthotic therapy are essential components in the treatment program for many orthopedic disorders. we have found them to be an effective tool in managing both acute and chronic musculoskeletal pain.

Unfortunately, most insurance companies do not cover custom made orthotics unless they are utilized for the treatment of diabetic conditions, or are permanently attached to a patient's shoe. Their definition of orthotics is limited enough that most biomechanical orthotic devices are not included in the scope of services that they cover. Due to this, we will need to collect the fee for the orthotics at the time of evaluation and orthotic casting. The fee for orthotics is \$292. This fee covers the casting and one pair of orthotics. The fee does not cover the evaluation or other physical therapy such as follow up fittings, adjustments, or therapeutic exercise. The evaluation and other physical therapy procedures are usually covered by insurance carriers.

We hope that this information helps to explain our policy on reimbursement for biomechanical orthotic devices, and we will be happy to discuss this issue with you in further detail. As always, our office will be happy to work out a payment plan with you so that any financial hardship, if present, can be minimized. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
